

PHMI Proof-of-Concept (POC) Milestones

The PHMI Technology Team anticipates starting the POC demonstration in mid-November 2022. With an 18-week duration, the POC will likely conclude in February 2023. CHCs are not required to adopt the PHMI platform to participate in PHMI

Identification Process

- 1. Released invite only RFI to leading organizations in the field of implementation support
- 2. Conducted level-setting meetings with each organization
- 3. 4 lead organizations submitted RFI proposals, each partnering with 2-4 organizations
- 4. Responses undergoing review; reviewers will share findings with KP sponsors to identify applicants to participate in the RFP process
- 5. Reviewers will conduct strategic interviews and score RFP responses
- 6. Make recommendation to KP sponsors for implementation support partner

The PHMI Evaluation

KP engaged the California Health Care Foundation (CHCF) to identify an evaluator to design and implement an evaluation for the PHMI. In August 2022, CHCF awarded the University of Chicago (U of C) a contract for the evaluation design.

- Evaluation scope:
 - Impact of PHMI on patients (e.g., quality of care, health outcomes, disparities, patient experience, access, and health care utilization)
 - Impact of PHMI on participating CHCs (e.g., capacity, systems change, culture, and quality metrics)
 - Effectiveness of the partnership between KP, DHCS, and CHCs
- U of C (+ their subcontractors JSI and SIREN) are contracted with CHCF through April 2023 for the evaluation design
- During the design phase, the U of C is:
 - Defining and prioritizing the key research questions and audiences
 - Determining the appropriate mix of quantitative evaluation vs. qualitative storytelling methods
 - Discussing key tradeoff questions such as approaches with control groups vs. non-controlled approaches
- The U of C is convening an evaluation advisory group to inform the evaluation design (first meeting 11/28)
 - Attendees include reps from KP, DHCS, CHCF, CPCA, RACs, CHCs and external SMEs
- Final evaluation plan due in April 2023
- The U of C will begin contracting with KP at the end of this year to implement the evaluation starting in April/May 2023
