
Activity Instructions

Step 2: Identify organizational strengths and assets that will contribute to the advancement of your seed. **~13 minutes**

Step 3: Identify challenges that may affect the success of implementing your secondary driver so your team can prevent and address them if they arise.

Step 4: Spend some time individually reflecting on what you've just discussed with your team. Share your reflections with one another. Together as a team, think through some small and immediate next steps you can take over the next two months to advance this seed. **~7 minutes**
