An aim statement is important because it clearly states a purpose or direction, ensures everyone is on the same page and sets a realistic target all while ensuring the outcome is equitable and inclusive. Together with your team use the template below to develop a SMARTIE Aim Statement.

MAKE IT SMARTIE

Specific – Use explicit language which succinctly details the intended outcome of your change initiative

Measurable – Quantitatively define what success will look like, using baseline data and stating the intended outcome, which will facilitate progress tracking

Achievable/Ambitious – Consider how good you want to be; are you meeting a threshold (just hitting a target) OR are you stretching beyond (setting a new bar)?

Relevant – Should explain who or what the project will impact (e.g., population of people) and provides rationale of why this is important

Time-bound – Establishes a date by which you want to accomplish this change (remember soon is not a time)

Inclusive – Brings the people who are most impacted into processes, activities, and decision making in a way that shares power

Equitable – Seeks to address systemic injustice, inequity, or oppression.
